Center. As most of you know, our access road was in desperate need of repair. We reached out and you heard the call, donating the funds that were needed for this extensive renovation.

Moser Grading Service, LLC has been hard at work; dozens of trees were removed, wetlands were drained and refilled with rocks, boulders, and new soil to shore up the road bed. The road was widened, several turn-outs were created, and the whole road, from highway to farmhouse, was covered in smooth black licorice blacktop.

After many months of hard work, we are thrilled to announce that our access road is complete! It's a beautiful road! A wondrous road! A road to be admired! Well, perhaps not by everyone, but certainly by the people who matter to us most. This solid, sturdy, rebuilt road will insure that our clients, who travel it every day during the spring, summer, and fall, will arrive safely, and comfortably. No more bumps! No more pot holes!

However, when Lexi arrived at Blue Lotus for the first ever Sibling Zip Day, it didn't take long for her to seek out Callie, who is also 9. They hit it off immediately and

were inseparable by the end of the day. Lexi and Callie also discovered that they live in the same city and have since begun play dates almost every weekend. This is exactly what we hoped for – prayed for – when we scheduled our first ever Sibling Zip Day.

Blue Lotus is dedicated to providing a healing day in the country for children and adults facing profound life challenges. However, we realized early on that parents and caregivers also need a day to unwind and restore, so we designated special days for them, which we refer to as Zip-A-Dee-Doo-Dah Days. But then it occurred to us that the brothers and sisters of special needs children, many of whom have made extensive sacrifices for their siblings, might need a special day all for themselves.

Thanks to a grant from the **West Bend Noon Rotary Club**, and the assistance of their generous volunteers, we had our first ever Sibling Zip Day, on May 4th, for the brothers and sisters of children with special needs. Grand Avenue Club Embraces Blue Lotus

"Soothing, powerful, healthy, and life-affirming." This is how **Rachel Forman, Executive Director of Grand Avenue Club (GAC)**, an organization that serves people experiencing mental illness, described her group's yearly visit to Blue Lotus. Rachel recently shared her thoughts with me. I'd like to share them with you.

"Before arriving each member is given a list of all of the wonderful activities that they can engage in surrounded by greenery, a forest, a lake, a swimming pool, and many trails." But she is quick to point out, "If you just want to sit under a tree, then simply sit under a tree.

"GAC's motto contains many 'rights' including the right to a vacation. For most of our

members, this is the only vacation they will have. Simply changing one's scenery can promote profound change. A trip to Blue Lotus shows that it doesn't matter your disability, color of skin, ethnicity, (or) religion; human needs are universal."

Then I asked her about the big take-away, "No matter how they spend their day, swimming, boating, or simply resting, all of our members take home a greater confidence and well-being in themselves."

As we were wrapping it up, Rachel offered the following, "I would like to see Blue Lotus acknowledged more broadly throughout the community. Civic leaders should support this enterprise. This accessible oasis, out of the city, contributes greatly to the lives of many people. A day at Blue Lotus is a life-enhancing experience."

And then my final question, "You must have many options, why keep coming here?"

"We return to Blue Lotus every year because, for us, Blue Lotus has become the summer home that none of our members have ever had. It is a place to return to, a place that is familiar, place that evokes wonderful memories, a place to which we will be welcomed warmly by staff and volunteers. We have never even considered looking into other options. We hope that Blue Lotus will be there for many more years!"

GAC has been returning to Blue Lotus every year since 2014.
